

How to Recycle

(Effective May 8, 2010)

Newspaper & Inserts:



What to include: TV guide, glossy type papers, magazines (please remove staples), flyers, rinsed milk cartons, boxboard (cereal boxes) all together. Papers cannot be weathered or wet.

How to Recycle: Paper items may be placed in a clear or blue bag that will be taken. Shredded paper **MUST** be placed in a clear or blue bag. You may also use open container that will be emptied and left.

Tin Cans:



What to include: Soup, pasta sauce, and vegetable cans.

How to Recycle: Rinse and remove the labels off the cans. If possible, remove **BOTH** ends, flatten the can and insert removed ends. Place into an open container that can be easily emptied. Your container will be left.

Glass:



What to include: Glass jars, any glass that is **NOT** broken.

How to Recycle: Rinse and remove lids and labels. Place into an open container that can be **TAKEN** by staff.

Aluminum Cans:



What to include: Drink cans.

How to Recycle: Rinse and flatten the cans at the centre and fold in both ends. Place the aluminum cans in an open container that can be easily emptied. Your container will be left.

Plastic:



What to include: Plastic milk jugs, margarine containers, water bottles, pop bottles, plastic containers with recycling symbol on the bottom.

How to Recycle: Rinse container and remove the caps. Caps are **NOT** recyclable and are garbage. Place into an open container that can be easily emptied. Your container will be left.

Plastic #1 or clear plastic (drink or water bottles) are recycled separately from other plastics.

Plastic #2, #4, #5, and #7 may be combined.

Corrugated Cardboard:



What to include: Cardboard boxes, packing boxes.

How to Recycle: Flatten and bundled or placed in a separate box.

Not everything can be recycled! Did you know that the following items CANNOT be recycled and should be thrown out in your garbage?

Items made out of more than one material (iced tea container), children's toys, Styrofoam (even with a # on it), milk caps, juice boxes, pop bottle caps, Tupperware, hard plastic (flower pots), and flimsy plastic (strawberry or cake containers) and plastic bags.

PLEASE REMEMBER THAT ALL ITEMS MUST BE SEPARATED IN YOUR BLUE BOX.
