

**TOWN OF CARMAN
BY-LAW NO. 00/1828**

BEING a By-law of the Town of Carman to authorize
the Abatement Project removing anhydrous ammonia tanks.

WHEREAS Section 48 of the Environment Act provides the authority for municipalities to undertake abatement proposals.

AND WHEREAS the Town of Carman passed Resolution Number 264, dated September 24, 1998, authorizing the submission of an Abatement Project of Linear Grain Inc. to the Province of Manitoba for consideration and review.

AND WHEREAS the Province of Manitoba saw it fit to have an Abatement Hearing by the Manitoba Clean Environment Commission on Tuesday, December 15, 1998 and the recommendations and findings of the Commission include the moving of the anhydrous ammonia tanks so the set backs can be adhered to, setting a maximum cost of \$170,000 for the Abatement Project and apportionment of the costs of the Project as Province of Manitoba 50%, Town of Carman 25% and Linear Grain Inc. 25%.


AND WHEREAS the Province of Manitoba has now provided a tri-party agreement to proceed with the completion of this Abatement Project.


NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Town of Carman, in meeting duly assembled, enacts as follows:

1. **THAT** the Abatement Project presented to the Clean Environment Commission and authorized by Resolution Number 264 dated September 24, 1998 is hereby approved by Council.
2. **THAT** the Mayor and Chief Administrative Officer are hereby authorized to sign the tri-party agreement between the Province of Manitoba and Linear Grain Inc. for the completion of this Abatement Project.
3. **THAT** the Town of Carman agrees to contribute towards the removal and relocation of the anhydrous ammonia tank identified by the Commission at a maximum proportion of 25% of the costs, not to exceed a contribution of \$42,500.00.
