

Carman-Dufferin Arena – Carman, Manitoba

Covid-19: Site Plan

Effective: September 3, 2021

***Pandemic Response:** *changes effective Friday, September 3, 2021.*

- **Masks use is mandatory indoors for all patrons age 5 and up at the Carman Dufferin Arena.**
- **Proof of Vaccinations, age, and photo ID for adults aged 18+ are required to enter the facility.**
- Youth (under 17) will not require proof of vaccination, if participating in scheduled organized youth programming.
- Ineligible youth (children up to 11 years old) will be able to enter the facility with a fully vaccinated adult.
- Sports and Recreation activities will be reduced to 50% spectator's capacity
Visitors = 140 Home = 196
- Encourage **one parent** only to attend children's activities.

Guidelines for all facility users:

- Stay home if you are experiencing symptoms, even if they are mild.
- Please follow the link below for the online self-screening tool before arriving at the facility. <https://sharedhealthmb.ca/covid19/screening-tool/>
- Screen participants, staff and volunteers daily for symptoms prior to work or participation in activities. Individuals who are ill with Covid-19 symptoms will not be permitted on site for work or scheduled activities.
- Always allow physical distancing of two meters (6ft); except brief exchanges when actively participating in a sport or activity.
- **Please come prepared to show both your vaccine QR Code and your ID. Personnel will be at the entrance scanning vaccination cards and checking IDs prior to admittance.**
- **Face masks are mandatory for players, coaches, officials, off-ice officials, volunteers, parents, and spectators when entering and exiting Carman-Dufferin Arena. Athletes, coaches, and officials DO NOT have to wear face masks while on the ice. Coaches are required to wear a mask on the bench. Spectators are required to wear face masks, except when eating or drinking.**
- Avoid congregating in shared areas, such as the lobby of the facility.
- Use of hand sanitizer when you enter and exit the facility.
- **Follow guidelines from sport organizations and facility site plans to minimize physical contact and risk of Covid-19 transmission between participants.**

- All users must adhere to their Provincial Sport Association Guidelines.
- All users are encouraged to bring their own filled water bottles.

Flow of People and Physical Distancing

- The maximum number of people permitted in lobby is 50, except where distinct groups of 50 can be separated to prevent contact with other groups through the use of separate exits, staggered schedules, as well as sufficient space to avoid congestion.
- To access dressing rooms upstairs enter the stairwell in the main entrance and exit to the north stairwell.
- All bookings will go through the Carman-Dufferin Recreation office and the booking system will be used, and non-contact payment is encouraged.
- Signage will be placed at the entrance of the facility to remind staff, volunteers and facility users of physical distancing measures.

Signage

- Covid-19 guidelines signage will be posted at the entrance of the Carman-Dufferin Arena.
- Signage will be placed throughout the facility reminding all patrons of physical distancing measures, hand hygiene, cough etiquette and mask recommendations.

Care & Control

- The renter of the facility is responsible for the actions of their group members.
- The renter is responsible for pre-screening the group members
- Anyone displaying signs of Covid-19 are not allowed to enter the facility.
- People who are ill should NOT participate in or be spectators of activities.
- **Showers are open if players are able to vacate on time.**
- Participants should bring their own water bottles and not to share with others.

Main Building

- **Please come prepared to show both your vaccine QR Code and your ID. Personnel will be at the entrance scanning vaccination cards and checking IDs prior to admittance.**
- **Face masks are mandatory for players, coaches, officials, off-ice officials, volunteers, parents, and spectators when entering and exiting Carman-Dufferin Arena. Athletes, coaches, and officials Do Not have to wear face masks while on the ice. Coaches are required to wear a mask on the bench. Spectators are required to wear face masks, except when eating or drinking.**
- Entrance through east doors (automatic accessibility door) follow arrows for entrance and exiting procedures.

- Exit through north doors (unless automatic accessibility door is required).
- Hand hygiene stations will be placed at the entrance and exit of the facility.
- Bathrooms will be open to public with limited capacity, CDR staff will sanitize frequently throughout the day and evening.
- Arena will be locked when there is no bookings or programs.

Washrooms and Dressing Rooms

- Cleanings will be posted in each washroom and dressing room in Carman Dufferin Arena.
- Maintenance staff will clean high touch areas every two to three hours in washrooms and after each dressing room use.
- Maintenance staff will complete a thorough cleaning each evening of washrooms, dressing rooms, water bottle fill stations, common areas, and high touch zones.
- Every other urinal and sink will be closed in the main floor bathroom to ensure physical distancing.
- **Showers are open if players are able to vacate on time.**
- Coaches, please use assigned dressing rooms.

A-Side Arena

- All indoor group activities permitted with no capacity limits on participants. This includes games, practices, competitions/tournaments.
- **Spectator capacity limited to 50% of the capacity of the stands. This includes other teams who are not active on the ice. (ie. Tournaments)**
- Maximum people in the stands – Wearing masks while physical distancing
Home Side = 196
Visitor Side = 140
- Bleachers will be sanitized on a regular basis but not after each use.
- Dryland training must take place outside.
- **Showers are open if players are able to vacate on time.**
- Ice users must bring their own water bottle, water fountains will be closed, however the water bottle filler will remain open.
- The CDR staff will clean high touchpoints frequently throughout the day and evening rentals.

- Ice user must exit the facility 20 minutes after their ice time is complete.

B-Side Arena

- Maximum people in ice viewing area – Wearing masks while physical distancing
B-Side Ice North Side = 6
B-Side Ice South Side = 2
- Maximum people in the inside B-Side Lobby seating = 24.
- Dryland training must take place outside.
- Bleachers will be sanitized on a regular basis but not after each use.
- **Showers are open if players are able to vacate on time.**
- Ice users must bring their own water bottle, water fountains will be closed, however the water bottle filler will remain open.
- The CDR staff will clean high touchpoints frequently throughout the day and evening rentals.
- Ice user will be allowed to enter dressing rooms 45 minutes prior to rental. It is strongly recommended that participants show up fully dressed, minus their gloves, skates, and helmet.
- Ice user must exit the facility 20 minutes after their ice time is complete.
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Kinsmen Meeting Room

- Kinsmen Room must be pre-booked through the Recreation office. A \$25.00 per use fee will be charged to all users.
- Maximum number of people = 11

CDR staff will monitor all users and remind of social distancing and mask use.
