BY-LAW N O. 24

A BY-LAW OF THE VILLAGE OF CARMAN TO PROVIDE FOR EARLY CLOSING OF SHOPS.

The Municipal Council of the Village of Carman Enacts as Follows:-

1. That this By-law shall take effect on the Thirtieth day of July A. D. 1900.
2. That from the said date the following classes of shops within the said Village of Carman, where or wherein goods are exposed or offered for sale by retail namely. General Merchants Furniture Dealers Mens' Furnishings, Tailors, Harness Makers, Jewelers, ~~and~~ Hardware Merchants, Grocers (but not where the only trade carried on is that of and Merchants, Grocers (but not where the only trade carried on is that of Tobacconist, News Agent, Hotel, Inn, Tavern, Victualating House or refreshment House) shall be and each of them shall be and remain closed on each and every day of the week between Seven of the Clock in the afternoon of each day and five of the clock in the forenoon of the next following day with the following exceptions; On Saturday's and during the last two weeks in December and also the days immediately preceeding the following days, namely, New Year's Day, Christmas Day, Good Friday, the Birthday of our Soverign, Dominion Day, Labor Day and any and all other days set apart as a general holiday either by statute or ~~by~~ proclamation, and all classes of shops in the Village as aforesaid shall be and remain closed from Ten of the Clock in the afternoon of the days hereinbefore mentioned, ^{as} excepted namely, Saturdays, week days in the last two weeks in December and the days immediately preceeding the following days, New Year's Day, Christmas Day, Good Friday, the Birthday of our Soverign, Dominion day, Labor Day and any and all days set apart as a general holiday either by statute or proclamation until Five of the Clock in the forenoon of the following day.

P E N E L T Y.

Any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall, unless otherwise specifically provided for by any of the provisions of this By-law, on conviction before the Mayor, Police Magistrate or any Justice or Justices of the Peace having Jurisdiction in the Village of Carman, on the oath or affirmation of any credible witness, forfeit and pay at the discretion of the said Mayor, Police Magistrate, Justice or Justices conviction, a penalty not exceeding the sum of fifty dollars in addition to costs for each offence, ~~and~~ and in default of immediate payment thereof it shall be lawful for the Mayor, Police Magistrate or Justice of the Peace convicting as aforesaid to issue a warrant under his hand and seal, and in case the said Mayor, Police Magistrate, Justice or Justices ~~xxx~~ of the Peace or any two or more of them are acting together therein, then under the hand and seal of one of them, to levy the said penalty and costs or penalty or costs only by distress and sale of the offender's or offenders' goods and chattels, and in case of no sufficient distress to satisfy the said penalty and costs or penalty or costs, it shall be lawful for the said Mayor, Police Magistrate, Justice or Justices convicting as aforesaid or any one of them to commit the offender or offenders to the Common Gaol of the Eastern Judicial District of Manitoba or to the Lock-up house in the Village of Carman for any period not exceeding twenty-one days, unless the said penalty and costs or penalty or costs be sooner paid.
