

BY-LAW NO. 92.

A By-law of the Town of Carman to provide for submission to vote of By-law No. 91 of the properly qualified electors, which said By-law No. 91 relates to the forbidding of the receiving by the Town of Carman any money for a license for the sale of Spirituous or Malt liquors and combination of liquors and drinks and drinkable liquids which are intoxicating.

And Whereas a petition has been presented signed by twenty-five per cent ^{or in number} of the resident electors of the Town of Carman praying for submission of a Local Option bylaw and it is necessary to provide for submission of same

Therefore the Council of the Town of Carman in Council assembled enacts as follows,-

The Council of the Municipality of the Town of Carman has had submitted to them and have passed the first and second readings of a Bylaw forbidding the receiving of any money for a License for the sale of any intoxicating liquors under the provisions of the Liquor License Act and a vote of the Municipal Electors whose names appear on the last revised Municipal Voters' list of said Municipality will be taken on the day and during the hours and at the places where the polling should be held in the year 1910 at the Annual Municipal Elections in said Municipality being Tuesday the 20th day of December, A.D. 1910, between the hours of 9 o'clock in the forenoon and five o'clock ^{am} in the afternoon at the Municipal offices ^{in the Electric Light Power House} in the said Town of Carman, and the proposed bylaw or a true copy thereof can be seen on file until the day of taking the vote at the office of the Clerk of the Municipality. The Clerk of the Municipality shall be the returning officer at such election.

The Clerk of the Municipality at his office at Carman will at the hour of two o'clock in the afternoon of Wednesday the 27th day of December A.D. 1910, finally sum up the Votes given for and against the said Bylaw.

The Mayor of the Municipality will be in

attendance at the Municipal office, Garman, on ~~Friday~~^{Six} the ~~eighteenth~~^{six}teenth day of December, A. D. 1910, between the hours of two and three o'clock in the afternoon for the purpose of appointing as by Statute provided persons to attend at the several polling Divisions, and at the summing up of votes by the Clerk on behalf of those interested in promoting or opposing the Passing of the said Bylaw.
