

TOWN OF CARMAN

BY-LAW No. 916 ✓

A By-Law of the Town of Carman to provide for the taking of a census of the inhabitants of the Municipal Corporation of the Town of Carman

WHEREAS it is provided in section 418 of The Municipal Act that a municipal corporation may, by by-law, provide for the taking of a census of the inhabitants, or of the householders in the corporation;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient and in the best interest of the Town of Carman that a census of the inhabitants of the corporation be taken;

NOW THEREFORE, the council of the Town of Carman, in regular council assembled, enacts as follows:

- (1) That a census of the inhabitants of the corporation be taken and that such census be completed not later than the fifteenth day of June, A.D. 1962;
- (2) That the enumerator for the Town of Carman be and is hereby designated and instructed to take said census;
- (3) That said census shall be taken in conjunction with the enumeration and preparation of the electors' roll for 1962;
- (4) That any and every inhabitant of the said Town of Carman who is or may be interviewed by the enumerator in the course of discharging his duties as enumerator and census-taker shall provide him with the following information regarding each and every person residing in the household in which the person being interviewed resides:
  - (a) Full name
  - (b) Occupation
  - (c) Whether Resident Owner, Resident or Tenant; British Subject; Husband or Wife, Son or Daughter
  - (d) Age in year A.D. 1962
  - (e) Postal Address;
- (5) That any persons guilty of a breach of the provisions of section (4) of this By-Law shall upon conviction thereof before a Police Magistrate or any Justice or Justices of the Peace having jurisdiction, either upon the confession of the party complained of or on evidence adduced, forfeit and pay at the discretion of the said Police Magistrate, Justice or Justices convicting, a fine not exceeding the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) and costs for each offence, and in the case of non-payment of the fine inflicted for any such breach, it shall and may be lawful for the Police Magistrate, Justice or Justices of the Peace so convicting as aforesaid, to commit such person to the common jail of the Eastern Judicial District in Manitoba for any period not exceeding twenty-one (21) days.
- (6) This By-Law shall take effect from and after the date of the passing thereof.
