

being a by-law of The Town of Carman to authorize the construction and installation of concrete sidewalks as a local improvement and to provide for temporary financing therefor.

WHEREAS the Council of The Town of Carman is of the opinion that concrete sidewalks three and one-half feet in width and four inches in depth should be constructed and installed in that part of the said Town hereinafter described, as a local improvement under the provisions of The Municipal Act, being Chapter 173 of the Revised Statutes of Manitoba, 1954, and amendments thereto, on the following streets, namely:

Project No. 1: Browning Avenue, east side, from lane south of South Railway Street to Boyne River footbridge, and west side, from footbridge to Maple Street, a distance of 250 feet, more or less, at an estimated cost of \$437.50.

Project No. 2: Fournier Avenue, east side, from Maple Street to Walnut Street, a distance of 265 feet, more or less, at an estimated cost of \$463.75.

Project No. 3: Villiard Avenue, west side, from Main Street south to south limit of the Town, a distance of 1,135 feet, more or less, at an estimated cost of \$1,986.25.

Project No. 4: Villiard Avenue, east side, from Boyne River crossing to a point 140 feet, more or less, north of the intersection of Sexsmith Street, a distance of 1,460 feet, more or less, at an estimated cost of \$2,502.50.

AND WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of section 692 et seq. of The Municipal Act, the Council of The Town of Carman has caused to be published in The Dufferin Leader, a weekly newspaper published in Carman, in Manitoba, for the issues dated the twenty-first and twenty-eighth days of May, A.D. 1964, a notice of its intention to undertake such local improvements in accordance with the plans and specifications on file in the office of the Clerk of The Town of Carman, and subject to the necessary approval and authorization of such undertaking by The Municipal Board being first had and obtained, that the cost thereof be levied by special assessments upon the lands to be benefited thereby and by a general assessment on all the rateable lands in the said Town of Carman, unless a majority of the owners of the lands affected, rated as such in their own names on the last revised Assessment Roll of The Town of Carman, or entered under the provisions of section 1051 of The Municipal Act as an owner of property on the current tax roll, representing at least one-half in value of such lands, petition the council against the same within one month after the first publication of said notice;

AND WHEREAS no sufficient petition against the said undertaking has been presented to, or received by, the Council of The Town of Carman;

AND WHEREAS the lands particularly benefiting thereby are specifically set out and described in Schedule "A" annexed hereto;

AND WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of section 696 of The Municipal Act, the Council of The Town of Carman did sit as a court of revision on Thursday, the twenty-fifth day of June, A.D. 1964, at the council chambers, Memorial Hall, at Carman, in the Province of Manitoba, to hear complaints against the proposed assessment, and no person

or his agent presented reasonable and sufficient objections thereto;

AND WHEREAS, to avoid the necessity of making supplementary levies, or refunding in case of over-levying, until the exact total costs of any work done or constructed have been ascertained, it is deemed expedient that the Council of The Town of Carman shall finance progress payments for the said local improvement from cash on hand in its General Funds until the exact total costs of the said local improvement are known;

AND WHEREAS, after the local improvement has been completed and the exact total costs therefor have been ascertained, The Town of Carman shall pass the necessary by-law authorizing the issue of debentures to repay the amount of the temporary advance or loan, and to fix the rates and levies required to retire the said debentures;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Town of Carman, duly assembled, enacts as follows:

1. THAT for the purpose aforesaid the Council of The Town of Carman may proceed with the construction and installation of the aforesaid local improvement and, having on hand in its General Funds sufficient cash to meet the costs of the said improvement, estimated not to exceed the sum of \$5,390.00, IS HEREBY EMPOWERED to make progress payments as they fall due for the said local improvement from its General Funds.

2. THAT the Council of The Town of Carman shall keep a separate ledger account to record the expenditures made in respect of the said local improvement, and shall open and maintain at its bank a separate capital bank account to which advances from General Funds shall be deposited as progress payments on the said improvement are required.
