WHEREAS Council of the Town of Carman deems it expedient to enter into an agreement under Section 15 of the Civil Defence Act with

The Rural Municipality of Dufferin;
The Rural Municipality of Grey;
The Rural Municipality of Roland;
The Rural Municipality of Thompson; and
The Village of St. Claude.


NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Mayor and the Secretary-Treasurer of the Town of Carman are hereby authorized and directed to execute an agreement in the form attached hereto and marked as Schedule "A" to this By-law as it may be from time to time amended.

READ a first time this fourteenth day of March A.D. 1968.





THE TOWN OF CARMAN
SCHEDULE "A" TO BY-LAW No. 68/1055

AGREEMENT PURSUANT TO SECTION 15 OF THE CIVIL DEFENCE ACT

DATED March 14 1968

BETWEEN:

- The Town of Carman
- and -
- The Rural Municipality of Dufferin
- and -
- The Rural Municipality of Grey
- and -
- The Rural Municipality of Roland
- and -
- The Rural Municipality of Thompson
- and -
- The Village of St. Claude.

WHEREAS the several municipalities above-mentioned deem it expedient to enter into an agreement pursuant to Section 15 of The Civil Defence Act for the purpose of exercising the powers conferred upon them by Section 8 of the said Act and outlining a general plan dealing with matters of civil disaster or war emergency, or both, within the said municipalities;

AND WHEREAS by virtue of the Federal Emergency Measures Financial Assistance Programme, the Federal and Provincial Governments will assist in the costs of such a programme, where it is deemed in the best interests of Emergency Measures, by accepting responsibility for a total of 90% (Federal 75%, Provincial 15%) of approved projects (other than certain specified items of operational equipment with a peacetime use and the Manitoba Provincial Revenue Tax on applicable items towards which no Federal contribution will be made);

AND WHEREAS the parties of this Agreement intend to establish an organization of the type contemplated in Section 8 of the said The Civil Defence Act and to apply to the Federal and Provincial Governments for financial assistance in connection with their programme;

NOW, THEREFORE, THIS INDENTURE WITNESSETH THAT:

1. The parties hereto mutually covenant and agree to enact by-laws pursuant to Section 8 of the Civil Defence Act for the purpose of establishing an Emergency Measures Committee and adopting the plan herein outlined;
2. The parties agree that the Town of Carman be and it is hereby designated as the Emergency Centre of the Emergency Measures area comprised of the party municipalities. An Emergency Measures Controller will be appointed jointly by the parties hereto to set up a headquarters in the Emergency Centre and to work under the direction of the Emergency Measures Committee under the supervision of the Manitoba Emergency Measures Co-ordinator;

3. The Emergency Measures Controller aforesaid will be charged with the responsibility of working under the direction of the aforesaid Emergency Measures Committee and any related sub-committees authorized by the parties hereto, with the objective of carrying out all reasonable preparatory steps designated to ensure, in the event of civil disaster or war emergency, that:

- (a) Essential departments of municipal government are able to make the most effective use of their personnel and resources;
- (b) Measures to ensure the survival and rehabilitation of the maximum numbers of the population be implemented without delay;
- (c) The security of essential records be preserved; and
- (d) The maintenance of law and order be provided for, and in addition, such other essential services as firefighting, restoration of utility services, emergency health and welfare services, and such additional emergency functions as the situation might require.

4. All expenses incidental to the implementation of this Agreement shall be paid in the first instance by the Town of **Carman**, the residual cost, after deducting all financial assistance relative thereto received by the **Town of Carman** from the Federal and Provincial Governments to be shared between the parties in the proportions hereinafter specified;

5. Each party hereto shall calculate and contribute its share of the residual cost of this programme on the basis of the ratio of its Equalized Assessment to the total Equalized Assessment of all the party municipalities.



Memorandum of an order of the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council approved and ordered by His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor on

AUG 12 1968

The Honourable the ~~Minister of~~ Provincial Secretary
having submitted to Council a report setting forth that:

WHEREAS section 8 of The Civil Defence Act provides, in part, as follows:

"8.(1) The council of a municipality may, by by-law, establish a committee and adopt a plan to deal with all matters of civil disaster or war emergency, or both, within the municipality.

(2) A by-law passed under subsection (1) shall not be finally passed until it has been submitted to the Minister of Municipal Affairs and, if approved by him, has been submitted by him to, and approved by, the advisory committee, if one is appointed, and the minister and has been authorized by an order of the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council.

(7) The powers and authority granted by this section to a municipality shall be exercised by it subject to all other provisions of this Act and the regulations, and to all orders made, and acts and things done, by the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council pursuant to this Act, and subject to the direction and supervision of the co-ordinator.

(8) The council of a municipality may appoint a person to co-ordinate and control, under the direction of the committee if one has been established by the council, any municipal civil defence organization; and the person so appointed shall co-operate with the co-ordinator."

AND WHEREAS section 15 of The Civil Defence Act provides as follows:

"15.(1) Subject to subsection (2), the powers conferred by this Act upon a municipality may, by agreement entered into by the respective municipalities, be exercised jointly by two or more municipalities on such basis as is determined by the agreement.

(2) An agreement made under subsection (1) shall have no effect unless it has been approved and authorized in the manner required under subsection (2) of section 8 in the case of a by-law passed under subsection (1) of that section."

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Town of Carman has by by-laws No. 68/1055 and No. 68/1056 under the provisions of Sections 8 and 15 of The Civil Defence Act, established a Committee described as The Emergency Measures Committee, consisting of ten persons, members of the Councils of the Town of Carman, the Rural Municipality of Dufferin, the Rural Municipality of Grey, the Rural Municipality of Roland, the Rural Municipality of Thompson and the Village of St. Claude;

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Town of Carman by by-law No. 68/1056 subject to the provisions of The Civil Defence Act has adopted a plan for dealing with matters of civil disaster or war emergency and has by an agreement being by-law No. 68/1055 with the Rural Municipality of Dufferin, the Rural Municipality of Grey, the Rural Municipality of Roland, the Rural Municipality of Thompson and the Village of St. Claude, agreed to appoint a comptroller of Civil Defence within the areas of said municipalities;

AND WHEREAS the said by-laws No. 68/1055 and No. 68/1056 of the Town of Carman and the agreement being Schedule "A" to by-law No. 68/1055 between the Town of Carman, the Rural Municipality of Dufferin, the Rural Municipality of Grey, the Rural Municipality of Roland, the Rural Municipality of Thompson and the Village of St. Claude have been submitted to the Minister of Urban Development and Municipal Affairs and approved by her under the signature of her Assistant Deputy Minister and the Provincial Secretary, the Minister in charge of Civil Defence/Emergency Measures Organization;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed advisable that the Provincial Secretary be authorized by order of the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council to authorize the said by-laws No. 68/1055 and No. 68/1056 of the Town of Carman and the agreement between the Town of Carman, the Rural Municipality of Dufferin, the Rural Municipality of Grey, the Rural Municipality of Roland, the Rural Municipality of Thompson and the Village of St. Claude being Schedule "A" to by-law No. 68/1055.

THEREFORE he, the Provincial Secretary, recommends:

THAT it is hereby ordered that the Provincial Secretary authorize the passing of by-laws No. 68/1055 and No. 68/1056 of the Town of Carman pursuant to The Civil Defence Act, by the Council of the Town of Carman.

And, upon consideration of the said report and recommendation on the 5th day of August A.D. 19 68 (the Hon. Mr. Weir in the Chair), Council having advised that it be done as recommended by the Honourable the Minister of Provincial Secretary

His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council was pleased to approve the said report and recommendation and to order that it be done accordingly.
