

THE TOWN OF CARMAN
MINUTES

Wednesday, April 3, 1974.

A special meeting of the council of The Town of Carman was held at 7:00 p.m., Wednesday, April 3, 1974, in the council chamber, Memorial Hall. Mayor D. L. Fletcher presided. Present were Councillors M. Burnett, F. Lucking, H. Isaac, J. E. Pethybridge and R. S. McKenzie. Councillor Shewchuk was absent.

Also present was Town superintendent, J. H. VanDijk.

The meeting was called by the Mayor and was for the purpose of considering further the question of flood protection dyking.

Several matters came up for discussion, including the following:


- (i) it was suggested that the province be requested to lend financial assistance in flood protection costs.
- (ii) it was agreed that the advice of the Town's solicitor should be sought on the question of legal liability insofar as damage to buildings on the water side of any dykes constructed is concerned.
- (iii) Mr. VanDijk reported that arrangements have been made for trucks and other machinery for dyking operations.
- (iv) The secretary suggested that pamphlets carrying sandbagging instructions might be delivered house-to-house in the flood plane by students, and Councillor Shewchuk assured council that this could be done by elementary school students.
- (v) the government's new policy on the supply of sandbags was noted.

It was agreed that a dyke should be constructed immediately in the lane between the Carman Hotel and the Ryall Hotel and on 1st Ave. S.W. from the Ryall Hotel corner to Main Street, and that should conditions warrant another special meeting would be called on short notice for the consideration of further dyking.

During brief discussion on the question of potatoes plugging sewer lines, the secretary was instructed to give notice to E.D. McEachern Ltd. that his water and sewer service will be terminated within ten days unless he can provide a proper suitable alternative.
