WHEREAS the Council of the Town of Carman deems it expedient and in the best interests of the Town to sell its estate and interest in the hereinafter set property, now



I have received a notification from The Municipal Board regarding the assessment appeal of Stow Seed Processors Ltd. The appeal will be heard in the Municipal Board Office on Thursday, June 20, 2002 at 9:30 a.m.

The salary paid to returning summer students was 60¢ above the minimum wage (\$6.60). As the minimum wage has been increasing, the pay has not because the resolution stated the \$6.60 salary. I spoke to Jim Harrison about this and it was felt that a resolution to clarify the 60¢ above the current minimum wage should be considered by council.

I took registration and attended at the Mayor and Reeves meeting held at the Carman Curling Club on Monday, March 11, 2002.

I have received a copy of the program for the 2002 Pee Wee "C" Provincial that was held in Carman on March 1 to 3, 2002. I will have it at the Council meeting for Council's perusal.

Bill Brant from Cochrane Engineering called and advised that the tenders for the filtration system in the water treatment plant will be going out at the end of this week with closing on Friday, April 5, 2002. The opening of the tenders will be in Carman.

The 2001 Census results are out and Carman experienced a growth of 127 people for a total population of 2831 or 4.69% increase. The Manitoba average increase was .5% and the Canadian increase average was 4.0%. Dufferin experienced decreases of 3 people, so they were pleased that they were able to hold their population stable.
